Mummy

In ancient Egyptian society preserving a body after death was considered a very crucial process necessary for entrance into an immortal existence. The importance of preserving the body was based on their cultural belief that the deceased persons soul must recognize the body and return to it. Ancient Egyptians believed that if the spirit could not identify the body it belonged to, it would die. As a result of this theology Egyptians developed an effective system of embalming. The Egyptian embalming process was a significant and complicated procedure, which was performed by priests.

The early Egyptians thought that after death their spirits would travel to another world during the day, and at night the spirits would return to their bodies. In order for the person's spirit to live forever, the spirit had to be able to identify and come back to the corpse. This is why the Egyptians wanted to preserve the bodies of the dead in as lifelike a state as possible. Egyptians believed mummification guaranteed eternal life for the spirit, which was considered essential in ancient Egyptian civilization. The practice of mummification was so esteemed in early Egyptian society that major criminals would not be executed, but denied the privilege of becoming mummified.

Priests that performed the embalming were forced to overcome several obstacles before perfecting the method. One major challenge was protecting the bodies. Slaves were forced to guard the remains, to ward off dogs as well as other scavengers.

Cairo City – Capital of Egypt:

Cairo is the capital and largest city of Egypt. The city's metropolitan area is the largest in the Middle East and the Arab world, and 15th-largest in the world, and is associated with ancient Egypt, as the famous Giza pyramid complex and the ancient city of Memphis are located in its geographical area. Cairo is located near the Nile River, it has long been settled. In the 4th century, for example, Romans built a fortress down on the banks of the river called Babylon. In 641, Muslims took control of the area and moved its capital from Alexandria to the new, growing city of Cairo. Five years later, construction on the hilltop Citadel, a military fortress and residential palace, began in the southeast of Cairo. Cairo during this period became the seat of Egypt's economic, political, and cultural life. The Mamluks chose the city as their capital in the thirteenth century.

Pyramid:

- In Egypt, kings and queens, called Pharaohs, were buried in huge square-bottomed pyramids built of stone. They were usually built to be used as tombs for Pharaohs. The ancient Egyptian pyramids are very well built. Some of the pyramids still stand today.
- The oldest man-made pyramid found is called the Step pyramid. It is in the Giza Necropolis in Saqqara, near Cairo, Egypt. It was built for King Djoser thousands of years ago. Later pyramids were built much larger. The largest one was the Great Pyramid of Giza. It is near Cairo. It was the tallest building in the world until the Eiffel Tower was built in Paris, in 1889. The Great Pyramid was built by the pharaoh Khufu (= Cheops) from the Ancient Egyptian Old Kingdom. Herodotus was told by his Egyptian guides that it took twenty years for a force of 100,000 slaves to build the pyramid (with another ten years to build a stone causeway that connected to a temple in the valley below).
- People once thought pyramids were built by slaves. More recent evidence suggests that the workers who built the pyramids were paid and well-cared for. They were loyal to the Pharaoh. Inside the Great Pyramid, famous man-made objects have been found from ancient times. Many valuable items were buried with the dead Pharaohs, in the hope that they would take them to the afterlife. Pyramids usually had traps to stop thieves from escaping easily. Tomb thieves were punished by death if they were caught. However, by 1000 BC, many of the pyramids had been robbed of their precious treasures.
- A large statue of a Sphinx stands near the pyramids at Giza. It has the body of a Lion and the head of a Pharaoh.
- The ancient Greeks called the Great Pyramid one of the seven wonders of the world. There are over 100 pyramids in Egypt. Most of them are on the western side of the River Nile. Some Egyptologists have different opinions on why the ancient Egyptian Kings built pyramids as their tombs. Pyramids have been excavated for about the last 200 years.
- The ancient Egyptians believed that the Egyptian pharaohs went to the stars to join their gods in the after life.

Suez Canal

Suez Canal was started in 1859 and completed in 1869 which was financed by the French and Egyptian governments as joint venture. Canal was maintained and controlled by the Universal Company of the Suez Maritime Canal which is an Egyptian chartered group. This land is the only bridge between Asia and Africa, and it remained the Egyptian land. Canal after its completion took the advantage of its surrounding areas and location; it became an important strategic area because this is the shortest path between the Mediterranean and Indian Ocean. This canal provided an easy access for trading between nations and helped Europe in particular to attain powers and govern their colonies. Due to debt and financial crisis in 1875, Egypt head sold shares of the canal operating company to the British government.

Nile River

At over 4,100 miles long, the Nile River is the largest river in the world. It is located in the northwestern part of Africa. The Nile River flows through many African countries. These countries include Egypt, Sudan, Ethiopia, Uganda, and Burundi. The White and Blue Nile are two extensive channels that feed into the Nile River. The Nile River runs north into the Mediterranean Sea. The Nile River had a major impact on Ancient Egypt and Ancient Egyptians. Around the same time, every year, the Nile would flood. The flooding would happen between June and September. There are two reasons people believed why. One reason was the snow and summer rain would overflow the river. Another reason, or theory consisted of the goddess Isis. Ancient Egyptians believed the Nile would flood because she would cry so much over the death of her husband, Osiris. Out of these two theories, back in Ancient Egypt the most believed one was the snow and summer rain theory.

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

Joint Winners of Nobel Prize for Economics – 2020



Paul R. Milgrom(USA) Robert B. Wilson(USA)

The Sveriges riksbank price in economic sciences in memory of Alfred Nobel 2020 was awarded jointly to paul R. Milgrom and Robert B.Wilson for improvements to aution theory and inventions of new aution formats. Their theoretical discoveries have improved autions in practice. Their discoveries have benefitted sellers, buyers and tax payers around the world. Robert Wilson developed the theory for auctions of objects with a common value- a value which is uncertain beforehand but, in the end, is the same for everyone. Wilson showed why rational bidders tend to place bids below their own best estimate of the best common value. Paul milgrom formulates a more general theory of auctions that not only allows common values, but also private values that varies from bidder to bidder. He analysed the bidding strategies in a number of well-known auction formats demonstrating that a format will give the seller his/her expected revenue, when bidders learn about each other's estimated values during bidding.

Keeladi Archaeological Excavation in Sivagangai District



Keeladi excavation site is a sangam period settlement that is being excavated by the archaeological survey of India and the Tamilnadu archaeology department. This site is located 12 kms south-east of Madurai in Tamilnadu, near the town of keeladi in sivagangai district. The settlement lies on the bank of the vaigai river and it reflects the ancient culture of tamil people. The excavation was first started in palisanthai thidal in manalur. The site was estimated to be from the period between 5th century B.C.E. and 3rd century CE. It was 2,200 year ago. The excavation was carried out in six different places almost 48 square pots have been cut and various structures and artifacts have been found, including frosts, brick walls, root tiles, pottery, mimic accessories, skeletal tools, iron vel, and Tamil Brahmi letter –etched plates. At the bottom of the settlement, there are buildings with a sewage canal facility made of ceramic tubes. The roulette avretine – type ceramic brought by merchants demonstrate business connections with the Roman Empire. Ornaments also have been found in keeladi.

An additional award, the Sveriges Riksbank prize in Economic Sciences in memory of Alfred Nobel, was established in 1968 by the bank of Sweden and was first awarded in 1969. After nobel's death, the nobel foundation was set up to carry out the provisions of his will and to administer his funds. In his will, he had stipulated that for different institutions –three Swedish and one Norwegian- should award the prizes.





Power point presentations are fairly common way of teaching. Pedagogical experts have determined that power point presentations are more likely to engage students than typical lessons without them and surveys have found that students feel like lessons with power points are more interesting than those without. Often this is because well-structured power points allow for small breaks in teaching by throwing in fun facts and even jokes in between large chunks of important information. Thus the learning continues without the students feeling bored or even overwhelmed by the volume of information. This makes it significantly more likely that the students will retain the information. By far one of the biggest advantages of power point presentations are that they help capture the student's attention in class, and not only capture, but keeps their attentions. Power point presentation transform the learning process from just reading or listening to not only both of those activities but also seeing. Elements that can exists is power point presentation include not only just text blocks but charts, tables, graphs, images, video and audio files. Slides can very easily be designed to match the requirements of revision and teaching material pictures can be easily attached to power point presentations or linked to them. Videos can be embedded into power point presentations creating a power point slide.

Laennec had discovered that the new stethoscope was superior to the normally used method of placing the are over the chest, particularly if the patient was overweight. A stethoscope also avoided the embarrassment of placing the are against the chest of a woman. Laennec was the first to classify and discuss the terms rales, rhonchi, creptance and egophony, terms that doctors now use on a daily basis during physical exams and diagnoses. Laennec perfected that art of physical examination of the chest and introduced many clinical terms still used today.

- ✓ The lettering should be large and simple. The titles should be shortened descriptive and the narrative should be as brief as possible and to the point. It is the best to use pictures, drawings and diagrams whenever possible
- ✓ Select colors tastefully. A single shade for background coloring is better than white
- ✓ Effective use of lighting enhances project
- ✓ The name and the class of the exhibitor should be on the display board
